It may be of interest to members to know that this club was organized on May 22, 1966, by a group of 22 chess enthusiasts who gathered together to write the constitution. The articles state that the club was formed to enable its members to play chess; engage in chess competition; to provide instruction, entertainment, and social life in chess, and to promote the popularity of the game of chess. Any person may become a member by paying the annual dues. While it is strongly recommended that members join the U. S. Chess Federation, such action is not a requirement for membership.

The "Battle of the Bumbler B" gathered together a grand bunch of chess players with ratings below the 1800 mark. While the turnout was somewhat less than expected, those that played had an enjoyable time, gained valuable tournament experience and some improved their USCF rating. Your club tournament committee gained some needed pointers on tournament sponsorship and will show improvement in future events.

J. Mathis won the \$150 first prize, displaying chessability beyond his official rating of 1758. Chuch Swords defeated a fair share of opponents to take home a cash prize. Other club members who particimpated in the 'B' were: V. Pope, P. Clarke, C. Daly, J. Jennings, T. Dimmick, M. Barthelow, who took the trophy for junior under 18, F. Mills, W. Kennedy, and G. Nelson, who acted as houseman to play those who would have won on forfeit.

Jerry Jennings won first place in the Fall Rating Tournament with his aggressive play and skillful combinations. The suave Lewis Meehan, who has played in tournaments before, earned the second place spot, while Bob Jones, a hard man to beat, placed third. Each received a trophy for his efforts and the improved ratings will show in the next rating issue of Chess Life. Mike Barthelow directed and played in this contest, turning in a fine job of directing but apparently the pressure of his administrative duties affected his game and he ended up half way down the list. Twenty six members entered this tournament and received valuable tournament experience, improved their ratings and enjoyed some serious chess. Congratulations to the winners and thanks to all of the club members who played in the tournament.

Alex Suhobeck, MPCClub was declared the Monterey County Chess Champion when he won the Monterey County Open held December 2nd and 3rd at the Neighborhood Center, New Monterey. Alex took home \$25.00 in cash and a handsome trophy for his efforts. D. Mathews, playing against strong opposition, captured second place, while Ted Yudacufski, assisted by his lovely wife Ruby, directed this important tournament was still able to top enough of his games to earn third spot. Other winners were Junior County Champion, N. Bogatirev; Class B award to C. Swords; Class C award to F. Mills; and the unrated award to W. Atkinson.

The nineteen entrants signed in from Salinas, Carmel, Marina, Seaside, Monterey and Pacific Grove. This tournament is set to become a really big show and should draw more tournament players from the southern part of the county. One of them would have been named the Monterey County Woman Champion and taken home the trophy for that event. It was also surprising that the Robert L. Stevenson School did not enter a contingent to battle for the junior crown. The Bob Luey Chess Team has some strong chess players and surely they could have made Nicky Bogatirev realize he had been in a battle. Perhaps next time. Congratulations to the winners and our thanks to all those who played in this event.

The December Rapid-transit tournament was won by a new member, Jerry Wallshlager, stationed at Ford Ord. Jerry is obviously a seasoned tournament player and when he gets his rating adjusted will come out as a high expert. Welcome to the club, Jerry, and our congratulations on winning this fun event.

Al Nonevitch won the Fast-Play chess tournament, played the same night. This is a real exciting fun game played without clocks, but with a caller calling "Move" every ten seconds to advise each player, in turn, to make his move. Ruby Yudacufski gave a fine performance as the caller and also announced the pairings for each set.

These enjoyable fast-chess games are played on the first Thursday of each month, other events permitting.

President Mills is planning a Club Ladder Contest, which he will direct. Details are still in the formative stage, but play will start very soon. Mills will be needing some help with the administrative end of his duties as contest director and will welcome assistance from anyone desiring to learn something about the administrative side of tournament chess.
