COMING EVENTS: The 4th Monterey International Open Chess Tournament will be held, in Monterey, Saturday and Sunday, June 8 & 9, 1968. This will be a USCF rated tournament, Swiss System, three rounds on Saturday and two rounds on Sunday. Previously held in March, this year's dates were taken by the Sahara-Tahoe National Open to be held at Lake Tahoe March 24-29. The site of our event has not been selected as of this writing, but is expected to be the Pacific Room of the Hotel San Carlos. We expect to be able to again secure the services of George Koltanowski as the director of this event. More on this as plans are firmed up.

The longest game ever played between masters lasted 168 moves! The scene of this gigantic struggle was the 1907 Carsbad Tournament. Six settings, consuming 221 hours, were required before Oldrich Dures, who had lost a pawn at his seventh move against Heinrich Wolf, capitulated.

"P-Q4" Although this move is nowadays considered the strongest opening move, Paul Morphy, one of the greatest masters in the history of the game, never began a game with 1. P-Q4.

Those members desiring to play match games would do well to arrange to play them on Monday nights, at the Monterey Youth Center, where all of the equipment required (sets, clocks, boards, score sheets, pencils, Official Rule Book, match reporting cards, coffee, cookies, and other goodies) are available. Remember that you must be a member of USCF to receive credit for your rating. Membership can be arranged by contacting the Club Secretary. Life time membership in USCF is only \$200.

Membership in the Monterey Peninsula Chess Club is for one year. Our year is from July 1st to June 30th. All that is required for membership is a desire to improve your game of chess. There are no other restrictions. You do not have to be a member of USCF to be a member of MPCClub. You will find that there are many desirable features to being a member of United States Chess Federation. A nationally recognized chess rating, that will be published in the USCF's monthly magazine - " Chess Life". Your subscription to Chess Life brings you news of all of the tournaments played throughout the world. Selected games of the worlds leading chess players. Chess problems. Answers to chess questions. You will be in the company of the leading chess players in the United States when you join USCF.

The election of MPCClub officers will take place during the month of June. For an active club you must have active officers. We will start canvassing the membership for nominees soon. If you would like to serve as a club officer check with Pill Kennedy and get your name on the list. If you want to nominate a member for office, check and be sure that member will serve. If you have some one in mind for nomination, and don't know how that person feels about serving as an officer, let others know your feelings and perhaps a committee can convince a reluctant member to become a successful candidate.

Remember that your elected officials are anxious to be helpful. If you have a suggestion on the operation of your club let them know. If you would like to have more club directed activity, such as limited class tournaments, or special exhibitions, lectures, instructions, team matches with other clubs, Simultaneous play with our own experts... anything ... let us know...

Our thanks to Mike Barthelow for donating a chess set to help the IPCClub get its barrel of chess pieces started. If you have, or know some one that has, a set with missing or broken pieces, and you don't think you need to keep it for sentimental reasons, donate to the barrel.

President Mills, on behalf of the MPCClub, presented the Robert Louis Stevenson School's Chess Club a smart looking trophy to be awarded to the winner of the School's 1968 Chess Championship Tournament. Bill Kondrat, president of the Club accepted the prize and thanked the members of MPCClub for the trophy and their efforts to improve the chess competition at the school. From remarks made by other members of the school's chess club, Bill may well be the one that takes the trophy home.

Kondrat, a resident of Napa, is one of three RIS students placing in the National Merit Scholarship program. In addition to his chess activities he is president of the Winston Churchill Forensic Club, is on the school's honor roll and is active with the school's track team.

Be sure to check your UNITED STATES CHESS FEDERATION expiration date. Remember, renew your membership through the MFCClub. It costs you no more and the club will make a few nickles to help buy trophies and other goodies. Check with your secretary.

MPCClub now has two chess clocks available, for a small fee, for the members to use in club activities. If you want to rent one of these clocks for a timed event, the cost is five cents for each player for each hour, or fraction thereof. Check with Ted or Ruby at the Casa if you want to reserve a clock for the Rapid transit events.
