Among the South Americans mentioned as likely entrants are Rossetto (Argentine Champion), Guimard, Flores (Champion of Chile), Cruz and Mendes of Brazil, Oliveira of Uruguay. Cuba's representative is being determined by a qualifying tourney, and Mexican Champion Araiza has already announced his participation. West Coast chess interest is being stimulated enormously by this tournament to be held at Pasadena from July 29th to August 12th.
