

Gee Tops in Sacramento

The annual tussle between J. B. Gee and M. O. Meyer for the Sacramento, California championship was resolved in favor of Gee this year. His $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ gave him a bare margin of half a point over his perennial rival. F. B. Jackson was third with $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$. (See page 9 for details).

The tournament was sponsored by the Capital City Chess Club and held at the YMCA from January 1 to April 14. The winner and runner-up received gold cups donated by the Capital City Club.

Gee, a 31-year-old accountant, first won the championship in 1944. He was co-champion with Meyer in 1945. Meyer held the title in 1942, 1943 and 1947. He is an auditor.
