At the conclusion of the 5th round, San Jose remains the solid favorite to repeat and take home the trophy for keeps. Except for a narrow escape against Pittsburg in the 2nd round, they have blanked all their opposition.

Sacramento still hangs grimly on to San Jose's heels, and if they get by

Pittsburg in the 6th round they will have an outside chance.
Pittsburg holds 3rd by an evelagh, but is favored to bell

Pittsburg holds 3rd by an eyelash, but is favored to hold the spot on the basis of an easier schedule in the last rounds. They made a tremendous showing against San Jose, but were upset by Modesto.

Stockton's team lacks balance at present, but will be tough if they get all their strength out at once. They nest still neet the strong San Jose & Fresno Clubs.

Fresno, after a fine start, has had trouble in fielding a team, and has not performed up to expectations.

Modesto supprised Pittsburg with the aid of theveteran Dr. C. J. Cook, who broke a 3-3 tie with a nice mate.

Visalia and Oakdale will settle the fight for the cellar when they meet in the next round. Oakdale must develop its own players, not having the popullation of the larger towns to draw from. Visalia has a somewhat inerperienced team which shows considerable promise. They gave Sacramento a tough battle at all boards before losing.

Bobl Burger is still riding the credt for individual honors. He leads George Kirby by one game. Both must face Milt Heyer yet. Milt and Hike Hailparn have outside chances to come in.

CCCL-6th Round N T Austin

After six rounds of play, Ssn Jose still mainted its 1/2 game lead over Sacramento by defeating Stockton in a hard fought match. Sacramento still hung grimly to its chances by defeating Pittsburg. Fresno moved into 3rd by winning from Modesto, and Oakdale broke the cellar tie with Visalia.

The next round pits the League Champions against Sacramento with the winner taking home the trophy. Fresno must beat Stockton to hold 3rd, while Pittsburg can tie Stockton for 3rd by beating Visalia if Fresno loses. Oakdale must beat Modesto to tie the last team in the standings.

The Sacramento-San Jose match promises to be quite battle and probably will be decided on the uppredictable lower boards. San Jose has an impressive record, having shut-out four of their opponents, but were hard prossed against Pittsburg and Stockton. On the other hand Sacramento was held to a tie by Fresno, but has not been held to close scores by any other opponent. The comparative scores follow:

San Jose played a stronger Stockton team and a weaker Fresno team than did Sacramento. The remainder of the opposition was approximately equal.

Although held to a draw in the last round, Rob Burger has the individual prize cinched. Second place will be decided by the Woolfe-Hailparn and Meyer-Kirby matches, only 1/2 point separates all four.

CCCL Individual Tournaments

The Committee appointed by President Mattingly to study the possibility of a CCCL Individual Champienship Tournement makes the following recommendations:

- 1. That the most satisfactory method of determing the Individual Champion is by means of a tournament, instead of by the best score at 1st Board during the League Season, as has been done previously.
- 2. That the Individual Championship Tournament be an Open Swiss System Tournament to be held in Modesto during March or April. This tournament shall be distinct from the State Championship Qualifying Tournament.
- 3. That the CCCL entry in the State Championship be determined by a Qualifying Tournament to be held in Modesto (or Fresno) on July or August. This tournament would be restricted to 12 strong players.

4 The Committee also suggests certain details of organization of the above tournaments which are discussed below.

Championship Tournament. This shall be open to any player who has played in at least one League match during the previous seasion. It shall be a 4-Round Swiss held over one week-end, i.e., two games Saturday and two Sunday. Should the number of entries be so large that a fair decision cannot be reached in 4 rounds, the entries shall be dividied according to strength into Major and Minor Sections. Experience has shown that with 4 rounds, the maximum number should be 16. The entry fee should be about \$5, out of which the rent should be paid, the remainder going toward prizes.

Qualifying Tournament. This would be very similar to the tournament held last year in Modesto, a 4-Round Swiss restricted to 12 strong players. The top 6 in the Open would be automatically qualified, the remaining places to be chosen by the Committee, with the restriction that at least one man from each Club be invited. The entry fee would be \$10, \$5 of which would be a deposit guaranteeing that the player would continue to the Finals, if successful. The remaining \$5 would go into the State Championship Prize Fund.

The holding of two tournaments is felt to be better in that many players prefer to play in the State Open rather than the State Championship, and in this way would not be deprived of a chance to play for the League title. Also, to insure adequate representation in the Finals, we must have a guarantee that the winner will continue to the Finals. Another point is the necessity of raising our contribution to the Championship Prize Fund.

In conclusion, the Committee wishes to express the opinion that, while the CCCL has successfully contributed to the improvement and enjoyment of Chess in Central California, it will further the cause still more by the regular scheduling of individual tournaments such as those proposed above.
