The experience gained will undoubtedly prove helpful, particularly in connection with properly evaluating middle and end games, which in several cases I literally "butchered" after having obtained slightly superior or at least even positions. There were present at each session a number of strong San Francisco players who were engaged in analyzing the games while they were in progress and pointing out to the players after the game ended some of the possibilities which arose in the course of their battle. Although it is concededly easier to find a series of moves or a combination when one does not have a clock ticking at his elbow and he can test variations knowing that if they don't work out he can go back and try again, the writer admits that he failed to consider some of the lines of play which were pointed out to him.

This was the first event in which I had played wherein the analysis of adjourned positions was not limited to the players directly concerned. I became aware of that when on Saturday, Nov. 27, the tournament winner mentioned "If you sealed P-N3 the game is a dead draw" and when another southern California player told me "If you sealed anything but N-K7 the game is drawn". It happened that the sealed move was P-N3, and after checking with the Tournament Director as to the handling of adjourned positions, I enlisted the services of one of the finest end game players in the State, who kindly consented to go to my hotel and analyze the ending with me. He concluded that the position was a draw, approved the line of play I had intended to adopt, and pointed out numerous tactical possibilities in a position which on the surface appeared to be devoid thereof, and only some of which I had considered. Certain it is that I resumed the game with more confidence than would otherwise have been possible, and if my benefactor reads this I hope he again accepts my thanks for his valuable advice.

Although I felt something like a minor leaguer who gets his first chance in the majors at an age when he should be retiring from baseball, I enjoyed the opportunity to play in the State championship. For the central California players who will qualify for future events I suggest solemnly that they anticipate tough games and hard work. They will not be disappointed.
