This tournament, 15 years and under, has ended with Jimmy Wood finally emerging as victor. At the end of the fourth round Jimmy was leading the tournament with a 4-0 score. However, in the fifth round, Wood lost to Miller, putting Miller then in first place with half-point ahead. Then in the sixth round, While wood was winning, Schulenberg beat Miller. As a result Schulenberg had the same score as Wood, 5-1. The two contenders then played a sudden death playoff with Wood coming out on top as champion.

There were 23 participants in this Six Round Swiss System Tournament, from 9 years old up to 16. The prizes went down to tenth place.

Besides a prize, Jimmy Wood also received a Junior Championship Trophy which was donated by Homan's Sporting Goods Store.
