(a) Ponziani's Opening is worth a try as a surprise menpon. Traps abound for the second player and Waite risks nothing more than equality sbould Black avoid all the pitfalls.
(b) The most direct challenge to White's dojvious plan for building a strong pawn center is 3 . . . P.e.f, since after 4 PxP? QxP the Queen cannot be driven away by $5 \mathrm{~N}-\mathrm{QBI}$.
(c) White strives for a vigerous opea game. With 4 P-As he can play a Philidor's Defense wilh a move in hard.
(d) Inferior to 4 . . NxKP SP-QS N-N1 6B-Q3 N-B4.
(e) Part of an organized effort to undermine wisk's advanced Pawn. The natural 5 ...N-Q4 ruTs up against 6 B-QB4 N.N3 7 B-N3, and White stands better whether or not Blark accepts the QBP.
(f) Carrying his strategy one step too far. Betler is simply 7... B.C2.
(g) Even stronger than $9 \mathbf{P x P}$.
(h) Of coarse ant 10 . . . a*N7 11 R.KI.
(j) The pressure on the Krile is unbearable. White tireatens 13 N-N4 with play similar to the game contlsuation.
(j) Escaping 14 B-N5 but to mo avaLL
(k) Not bad...
(1) Black should resign here, sat he hangs on for the grand finale instead. Chigorin mest have been pleasad to obllge.
