Pr sently co-holder of the California State Rapid Transit Championship, our man of the hour has proved continuously his great prowess as a rapid player; his high expert rating also proves that he's no slouch in tournament play either. A real combination of many talents!

Allan TROY is leaving the local chess scene within the next week or two, to take up a position in New York. We wish him the best of success, and can only hope to welcome back this dedicated friend whenever the time comes. We thank you, Allan TROY, and you may be assured that your name will be firmly engraved in the annals of our league.....

Frank PYE of Downey, that is, who is making a great come-back in local chess circles, acting about like a real sabre-toothed tiger, we tell you. Why, even the mammoths are afraid of him!

Frank's latest triumph comes at Whittier, with the conclusion of the First Annual Whittier Amateur Open Chess Tournament. Out of a formidable group of 24, PYE emerged on top with 5½-1½, beating out runner-up John POSTMA (also of Downey) by a ½ point on tie-braking. The winner lost but one game, to Ed BARRIOS in the third round; his ½ point was against POSTMA. Third-finisher Ed BARRIOS could have tied the leaders, but was only able to gain a draw from HAYES. In fact, by winning, BARRIOS would have placed on top! The fates that are all around us....

A special mention is due to FOSTMA, who finished undefeated. Also to Ed BARRIOS, who, in addition to doing pretty well over the board, successfully directed the tournament. PYE and FOSTMA shared \$52, those with 5 - 2 received \$5 each.
